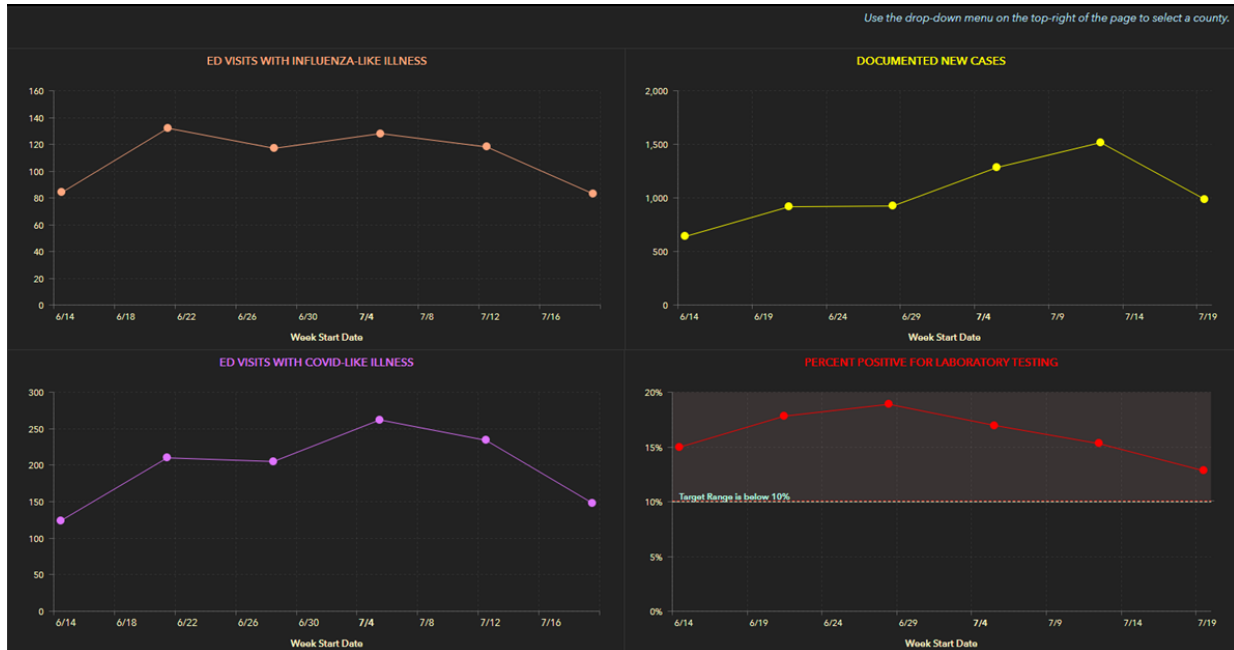
No Cloth Masks on Campus, Pick Up a Medical Mask to Wear

Avow has required face coverings while at work for some time. We are now requiring all of our employees to wear at least a medical mask at work as opposed to hand made masks and face coverings. All employees have access to Avow provided medical masks and may pick them up at the following locations:

- Lyon Center front desk.
- Smith Building near the front desk or near the PPE closet.
- Staff at Hospice House will continue to wear N-95 masks as their role requires. Those who may wear a medical mask, may obtain them through leadership in the unit.
- Clinical staff may continue to pick up all Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as they have previously.

Avow continues to monitor Health Metrics around Covid-19. You will see that cases of COVID continue to increase in the county and we continue to be well

above the targeted range of no more than 10% positive. Please consider that anyone you come in contact with may have COVID even if they are asymptomatic. Wear your mask, maintain greater than 6 feet whenever possible. If your role allows you to work from home, and with supervisor approval, please work from home. Limit time on campus to minimum necessary.



Lunch on Campus

Staff working on campus must request lunch with an email or phone call to Meghan Ahlbrandt (Smith Center) or Sue Aceto (Lyon Center) by 9 am daily to be included in the daily count. Standard or vegetarian options are available. Lunches are delivered to the Smith break room and Lyon Center lobby at 12:30 pm daily for your retrieval.

Those working onsite on Saturdays and Sundays should place orders with James Sager.

Considerations for Health Care Workers to Reduce the Spread of COVID-19

Know how it spreads

- There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- **The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.**
- The virus is thought to [spread mainly from person-to-person](#).
 - Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks.
 - These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.
 - Some recent studies have suggested that COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing symptoms.
